



## Pao Houa Her

Pao Houa Her is known for her powerful photographs focusing on the Hmong diaspora in the United States and Laos, exploring themes of identity, longing, displacement, and social and ecological resilience. Using a formally rigorous approach and working with both color and black-and-white photography, the Twin Cities-based artist engages with the legacies and potentials of landscape, portraiture, and documentary photographic traditions.

Her holds an MFA in Photography from the Yale University School of Art and a BFA in Photography from the Minneapolis College of Art and Design, and is an assistant professor of Photography at the University of Minnesota. Pao has shown extensively in Minnesota, and nationally, and is the recipient of many prestigious fellowships and grants, including two McKnight Visual Arts Fellowships and, most recently, a Guggenheim.

Born in Laos in 1982, Her was raised in Minnesota and is based in Blaine.
